Challenging News from the Good Samaritan School for Deaf Children, Uganda

ost of the children at the school were sent home when the Ugandan government shut all schools at the start of a national lockdown, most recently since June 2021. This is having a great impact on all the children in the country. Vaccines are being rolled-out with free 'jabs' only being available for ordinary people on a limited scale since June. At the School now, there are still about 25 to 30 children left there because either they are orphans or because it is too dangerous for them to be at home with their families. For them, the School is truly their haven and home. Their ages range from 8 to 18 years old. It has just been announced that all schools should be reopened in January.

The children help to look after the School's garden where they have a range of vegetables growing apace! They have just started harvesting them last month, especially the collards, green peppers and eggplants. The cabbages haven't harvested but hopefully they will start around the third week of this month. Our photos, taken on 16th October, show the results of their labours. Fortunately everything grows quickly due to a regular supply of rain, though this is becoming increasingly problematic.

The School depends upon these greens as their staple diet but it needs to be supplemented with rice, maize flour (Posho), beans, Irish potatoes







and others. At the moment they have no regular source of funds for food, but after a donation from supporters, a trip to Kampala has been arranged to buy more supplies.

Rosemary and Infinity Ideas charity are making plans to establish a project for funds so that a larger vegetable garden can be developed so that more food can be grown for the school's kitchen. Some of the spare crops could be sold at the local market to provide much-needed funds.







Each cabbage on market is sod at Ugx 2,000 (approx. £0.5) and each green paper is sold at Ugx 150 (approx £0.04)" The plan is to create a sustainable system which eventually include providing 'green' wood supply for the cooking fires. In the long-term it may be that a solar-driven cooker can be provided so as to reduce the need for wood-burning.

We have also applied for funds from the Rotary International charities, with support from the Masaka and Barnet branches, for funds to sink a bore hole for a regular water supply to the school and local community. We await further work on this application, so we hope and pray!

Christmas Appeal – for food!

We thought that you would like to know that there is an appeal for funds to supply food for the GSSDC School for this Christmas time. This is not only to provide them with Christmas fare but also to help give them some basic food stuff for when the vegetables, rice, beans and maize flour run out which looks like being in mid-November. Please contact us and pray for the school at this difficult time.

Please pray

1 For Uganda - that the supply of free vaccines will be increased rapidly so that the population will be made safe;

2 that the children and staff left at the School plus the local community of Kitengeesa, will be kept free from COVID19;

3 that funds for food for the School will be forthcoming now and in 2022, and

4 that the children return to school for lessons in January and that God will bless all at the school as lessons re-start.
